A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE PROJECT COST FOR MULTI-MODAL OPPORTUNITY FUND (MMOF)  
GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, Hinsdale County is one of 64 counties in the state of Colorado;

WHEREAS, Hinsdale County participates in regional efforts for travel-planning and transportation infrastructure work with the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT), Region 10, and the Transportation Planning Region and is eligible to submit this project under the multi-modal opportunity fund (MMOF) grant;

WHEREAS, pre-work to determine eligibility of the project has been conducted;

WHEREAS, the economy of Hinsdale County relies on outdoor recreation tourism; Hinsdale County is 96% public land offering a plethora of outdoor recreation activities; America's Byways Silver Thread Scenic & Historic Byway and the Alpine Loop Backcountry Byway traverse Hinsdale County and are incorporated into the "project area" (four miles from Highway 149 to the inlet of Lake San Cristobal along County Road 30); Lake San Cristobal is the state of Colorado's second largest natural lake and multiple types of outdoor recreation are increasing;

WHEREAS, Hinsdale County supports improving safety of bicyclists and all travelers along the four-mile project by creating two designated and marked bike lanes;

WHEREAS, Hinsdale County relies on grant-funding for capital improvement projects such as the application proposes and respectfully requests financial hardship waiver to submit a ten percent match;

WHEREAS, Hinsdale County previously submitted a grant application prior to the deadline and approved Resolution Number 10, Series 2022 on May 4, 2022;

AND WHEREAS, Hinsdale County met with CDOT engineers to review volatile oil and gravel costs during a site visit on received more specific recommendations on project costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of Hinsdale County, Colorado proclaims that, based on the above findings, we:

1. Update the on-file grant application supported by Resolution 10-2022 with an MMOF grant request of \$900,000 and commit a ten percent match of \$100,000 and
2. Remain committed to traveler safety and multi-modal outdoor recreation and travel.
